

Waldorf Toys



Waldorf toys are beautiful, simple, eco-friendly, and allow for development of imitativ and imaginative play. These toys are often made from natural materials such as wood organic cotton, wool, and silk. When a baby or toddler plays with these toys, they stimulate the senses allowing for sensory development. These days, many families are searching for natural and eco-conscious toys, and Waldorf toys generally fit that demar

Aesthetic Appeal

Toys should be beautiful. When children have a lovely environment to play in, they ca truly create wonderful, imaginative concepts. The materials Waldorf toys are made fro are natural, aesthetically pleasing, and use a variety of rich colors.

Imagination and Imitation

Waldorf toys invoke imaginative and imitative play, cultivating creativity. Traditionally Waldorf toys are minimalist-- lacking details, allowing the child's imagination to fill i

the rest. Toys are open-ended, with no confinements to creativity. Children can easily pretend that objects are many different things, depending on what their play requires.



Play in the USA






There are eight "Lend & Learn" Toy Libraries in the state of Missouri. The well-established social services program equips safe locations in the area so that families can play freely together. "We encourage open play that helps the children build social, emotional, cognitive, motor, and language skills," says Tammy Byington, Director. "We work hard to ensure that the programs continue from year to year since they give these families something they might not otherwise material a priority – that is, quality, open playtime."

The program serves families who live in multi-need communities and have little time for play. They provide opportunities for parents to connect with other parents, both during regular hours a at group events.

Its umbrella program has facilitated the opening of 12 toy libraries in nearby school districts. First Chance for Children also supported the opening of toy libraries at apartments and at the Universion of Missouri.

Spotlight on...South Africa!



Toy libraries in South Africa serve children and families in <u>so</u> many different ways: In homes, on farms, in urban communities, in rural communities, and in public libraries. In this issue, we'll focus on urban and rural communities, as well as public libraries.

URBAN

The KenFac Toy Library in Kensington (Cape Town) has been operating for eight years. The Facility is a community initiative which services children and parents from all walks of life, ensuring that a solid foundation is laid in the lives of young children. KenFac is amember of the ECD Forum, which is a place to share ideas, tackle challenges appropriately, and offer suppor to other toy librarians.





RURAL

LETCEE (Little Elephant Training Centre for Early Education) LETCEE currently manages eleven toy libraries in the rural communities of KwaZuluNatal-three are mobile and eight are fixed. Various services are offered, including "come-and-play" sessions every day. Most children in these areas do not have their own toys. Many do not have t opportunity to play with toys with an adult who encourages active learning. To ensure learning continues at home, and recognizing parents/caregivers as the children's primary educators, they also offer a lending service to the community members along with caregiver training. Parents/caregivers & children can come in to play with the toys, then receive training by the toy librarian.

> Training topics covered include: Learning through Play Stimulating Children's Development Making Toys from Found Materials Positive Discipline

LETCEE has one mobile toy library that specifically focuses on children with disabilities (The Pla able Pickup). The toy librarian runs inclusive playgroups, does home visits to educate communi members on disabilities, and helps break down the stigma still strongly associated with disabilities in these rural areas. The toy librarian also discusses developmental stimulation and t importance of accessing health care with parents.



PUBLIC LIBRARIES

Zwelethemba Public Library

Zwelethemba is a public library situated in a large township outside of Worcester in the Wester Cape. Their come and play toy library caters to children of all ages.

On Wednesdays, organized groups of children come with their teachers and caregivers to enjoy various play opportunities. On Fridays after school and during school holidays, children all ages come and play at the toy library.


